



Contest's Bases

This contest aims to test the bird identification capabilities of the participants, awarding a prize to the one with the highest score.

1. The contest will take place on Saturday, 25th, September, 2021 at 8:00 p.m. in Conference marquee 1 of the *Delta Birding Festival* (DBF).
2. The contest will be done through a digital tool called Kahoot that allows the images to be projected and give four answer options for each one.
3. To participate, you must either have the Kahoot app downloaded on your mobile phone or enter www.kahoot.it. In both options, it will be necessary to enter the code of the contest provided by the organizers and the name of the participant.
- 4 Participants must choose one of the four response options, using their mobile phone.
5. The score which designate the winner of the contest is automatically generated from the number of correct answers and the speed at which it is answered.
6. Places are limited and, in case of reaching the maximum capacity, participants will be accepted in strict order of arrival.
7. The contest will consist of correctly identifying a greater number of species in the shortest time possible in a display of 20 images.
8. The characteristics of the images will be the following:
 - a. 20 photographs of pelagic species from the Southern Hemisphere taken by Rafa Armada.
 - b. Each image will be displayed for 20 seconds. If at the end of this period, the contestant has not answered, he/she will get 0 points for that answer.
 - c. Species can be repeated

d. The name of the species will be displayed in English and scientific, following the IOC nomenclature.

9. The taxonomic and nomenclature criteria for the identification of species is that of the IOC World Bird List (www.worldbirdnames.org)

10. It is allowed to use bird identification guides during the contest.

11. The organizers of the contest and the staff of the DBF organization (volunteers not included) may not compete.

12. The award, sponsored by Lynx Eds., consists of the recently published book "Seabird. The New Identification Guide", by Peter Harrison.

13. The organizer is excluded from responsibility for any failure of the mobile phone, electronic communications, downloads or interruptions in the supply of the Internet (both its own and the Festival's) or the malfunction of the Kahoot software. The Organizer is not responsible for changes or effects on your mobile phone that may be caused as a result of participating in this contest.
